Samuel's Strong Spiritual Foundation

- He grew up in a sacred environment,
- learning to listen to God's voice and serve Him faithfully.
- This prepared him to be a strong prophet, judge, and leader of Israel.

Lack of Positive Parental Influence

- Being raised in the temple
- Samuel had limited parental guidance from his own family.
- His primary role models were:
- Eli
- Hophni
- Phinehas

Repeating Eli's Mistakes

- Samuel's own sons, Joel and Abijah, did not follow his righteous ways.
- were corrupt, accepting bribes and perverting justice (1 Samuel 8:1-3).
- mirrored Eli's failure to properly discipline his sons
- Samuel may not have been an active or strict father.

Lessons from Samuel's Experience

- Faithfulness to God is crucial, but parenting requires intentional guidance and correction.
- A godly upbringing does not automatically guarantee righteous children—active teaching and discipline are necessary.
- Parents must balance their roles—whether in ministry or leadership—without neglecting their family.

On Moses.... Early Influence Shapes Character

- Moses' mother secretly nurtured him during his early years
- This foundation influenced his later decision
- Early childhood training in faith and values impacts lifelong decisions

Lead by Example

• Children learn from what they see. Demonstrate kindness, honesty, patience, and respect in daily life.

Encourage Empathy & Kindness

- Teach kids to recognize and respect others' feelings through
- sharing,
- taking turns, and
- understanding perspectives.

Foster Gratitude

- Practice gratitude as a family by saying
- 'thank you,'
- appreciating small things, and
- acknowledging efforts.

Teach Responsibility

- Assign age-appropriate tasks like
- · making their bed,
- doing chores, etc. to build accountability.
- "As your Children grow up, learn to reduce their comfort and Increase their responsibility"

Promote Honesty & Integrity

• Create a safe space where children feel comfortable admitting mistakes without fear.

Cultivate Respect for All

- Correct Disrespectful Behavior Calmly
- Teach Respect for Personal Space and Property
- Teach the Power of Words

Encourage Assertiveness, Not Rudeness

- Teach them to say "no" firmly but respectfully:
- Support Their Decisions:
- respect their choice.
- Build Their Self-Confidence:
- reinforce their right to set boundaries.

Encourage Perseverance

• Praise effort over results, teaching kids that mistakes are learning opportunities.

Instill a Love for Learning

- Encourage curiosity by:
- reading books
- Exploring
- and having meaningful conversations.

Set Boundaries with Love

• Use consistent and fair discipline to reinforce that actions have consequences while showing love.

Practice Generosity & Service

• Engage children in acts of giving, like donating toys or helping others, to nurture generosity.
